


# **Miles of Diapers Program**



"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Philippians 4:6 Many times, I am asked what my favorite holiday is. Since most people expect for me, as a priest, to say Christmas or Easter, I am almost ashamed to say that it is Halloween. Now, before you judge me, let me tell you why.

When I was a child, my family lived at the church's rectory. which was located on church property, right across from the church building. The whole property was fenced off, limiting our access to the neighbors. My sisters and I attended the local public schools, where there were many Halloween-related activities throughout the month of October. So, by the time Halloween night came around, everyone was excited to go trickor-treating; well, everyone except for the three of us. We couldn't go because we didn't live in a neighborhood where we could walk around to knock on neighbors' doors. We moved out of that house, when my father retired, but we were already grown by then.

Now, I know many people find it weird that a priest would like Halloween so much and others even question why a church would recognize the holiday at all. In all actuality, Halloween is a combination of pagan and religious feasts that evolved over time.

The earliest celebrations date back 2,000 years in the Celtic regions of Ireland, Northern France, and the UK. November 1st was their new year, and it marks the end of summer and the end of their harvest season. The cold bitter winter would be coming soon, marking a time of many deaths and they believed that, the night before, the lines between the worlds of the living and the dead were blurred. They commemorated the day by having large bonfires where they made sacrifices of crops and animals to their pagan gods, while wearing

costumes made of animal heads and skins. This celebration was called "Samhain" (pronounced "sow-in").

When the Celtic territories were conquered by the Roman Empire, the celebration of Samhain was combined with Roman celebrations to the Roman gods. But, by the 7<sup>th</sup> century, Pope Boniface VI proclaimed November 1<sup>st</sup> All Saints' Day or "All-Hallowmas". That meant that the celebration of Samhain became known as "All-Hallowmas Eve" and eventually "Halloween".

When the New World was discovered, this celebration was limited to the areas of the country that were saturated by Roman Catholics, such as Maryland and some of the southern colonies. Then, in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> Century, large scale immigration from Ireland began, due to the potato famine. These new immigrants brought with them their traditional festivities of Halloween, based on the Roman Catholic influences of All-Hallowmas. Over time, because of the popularity of the festival and the diversity of religions in this country, Halloween became a secular celebration for all to enjoy, with no mention of its "All Saints' "connection.

Today, most people have no idea that Halloween is meant to be a commemoration of the Eve of All Saints' Day, which is an important day in the liturgical calendar of our church. In fact, many know it to be more of a commercial holiday than a commemoration of anything important. All of those initial reasons for a celebration are no longer valid or relevant in our society.

I choose to think of Halloween as a day of fun, giving us the opportunity to dress up as our favorite characters, share some candy and a whole lot of love with our communities. In the meantime, we can also remember how our world has evolved over thousands of years and, through Jesus Christ and his disciples, the rest of the world, including the Celts, were able to share in the joy of Christ's life, death and resurrection.




