From Our Priest-in-Charge

It feels to me like we are just barely out of the Christmas season and yet here we are just about to enter into the season of Lent. I guess it is true that time flies when you're having fun.

In the past, St Peter's has joined in the observance of Shrove Tuesday, so we have decided to revive the tradition. It wasn't a hard choice to make, given that I love pancakes and I love bacon but many have asked me what Shrove Tuesday is and what does the word shrove even means.

Shrove Tuesday is celebrated on the last day before the season of Lent begins. This year it falls on Tuesday, February 13th. It is also called "Pancake Tuesday", "Pancake Day", or "Fat Tuesday". Because Lent is, traditionally, a time of fasting and prayer, the practice of getting rid of all the rich foods that would not be consumed during Lent developed. Those foods were things like butter, cream, milk, sugar and eggs – hence the making of pancakes. There are still many people who partake in the practice of fasting during Lent, some to greater extent than others.

The word "Shrove" is derived from the Germanic word "shrive", which means absolve. Apart from ridding their pantries from the foods they would not eat, faithful Christians also had the custom of going to Church the days before Lent to confess their sins and seek absolution. Therefore, the three days before Lent are called the season of Shrovetide.

The season of Lent is a 40-day period which begins, this year, on Ash Wednesday, February 14th and extends through to Holy Saturday, March 30th. Now, if you've done the math, you'll notice that period is a total of 46 days, not 40. The Sundays during Lent (6 in total) are not counted in that 40-day period. That is because, as the church of Christ, we celebrate the Resurrection every Sunday of the year, not just on Easter Sunday.

I hope that you will participate in the activities of Shrovetide and Lent. It is a time of repentance and renewal; a time to strive to become better versions of ourselves in this world and for our faith and our reliance on God to grow in every way. On Ash Wednesday, I will invite you to be a part of that process with these words:

"Dear People of God: The first Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church to prepare for them by a season of penitence and fasting. This season of Lent provided a time in which converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when those who, because of notorious sins, had been separated from the body of the faithful were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to the fellowship of the Church. Thereby, the whole congregation was put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel of our Savior, and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word."



On Friday, March 1, join Rakad Dance Camp for a night of glamour and giving as we host an Old Hollywood-themed fundraising gala.


This event is a semi-formal fundraising gala to benefit Rakad Dance Camp. There will be dinner, dancing, door prizes, silent auction, and more!


