# From Our Priest-in-Charge

When I was a child, I remember waking up on Easter Sunday to the sounds of the birds chirping louder than I had ever heard them any other day of the year. It helped that the A/C in the rectory never worked properly and we had to sleep with the windows open. To this day, I'm sure that the birds conspire to make Easter mornings the most beautiful day of the year.

Although I was here, last year, for part of Lent, this will be my first time commemorating Holy Week and celebrating Easter Sunday with you all. I am very excited that this year, along with our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services, we have also scheduled the Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday of Holy Week. This service, which is also called Paschal Vigil, is the first official celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. Historically, it is the service where people were baptized. Today, it is the preferred service for a baptism but it is also a time when all present renew their baptismal vows. It is always held in the hours of darkness between sunset on Holy Saturday and sunrise on Easter Day. The service begins outside with the lighting and blessing of a fire that will light the Paschal candle, which is then followed by a procession into the church and the placement of the candle at the altar. The Service of the Word can then include up to nine readings from the Old Testament, telling the story of God's relationship with his People. I promise we won't read that many but we'll have a nice sampling.

Among the Western Christian churches, which includes the Roman Catholic Church, the Lutheran Churches and the Anglican Communion, the Easter Vigil is the most important service of the year. Although a service once limited to "Anglo-Catholic" parishes in the Episcopal Church, today it has become a favorite and is celebrated in most Episcopal churches, to varying degrees. In my opinion, one of the most important aspects of the service is that, after 40 days of Lent plus 6 Sundays in between, we finally get to say "Alleluia, the Lord is Risen."



# **Ministry Spotlight**

On Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>, the Latino congregation, which was once worshipping at St. Catherine's Episcopal Church, celebrated their first service here at St. Peter's.

Founded in 2017 by the Reverend Ricardo Medina, the congregation flourished under his direction but there were strains in their relationship with the host church. Their ministry was, and continues to be, funded by a grant from the Diocese while their relationship with the host church was of landlord/tenant. As with any transition, when Father Medina left, in 2022, to answer a call in North Carolina, the majority of the congregants, who had with time moved further away, stopped attending. Mother Natalie was asked, by Bishop Howard, to serve that community and to repair the relationship with and work alongside the Priest-in-Charge of

St. Catherine's. Nevertheless, the struggle to grow the church within a neighborhood with no Latino community and with limited use of the church building was difficult. There was a core congregation of faithful, who attended on a regular basis but new members were few and far between. When Mother Natalie was then called to St. Peter's, the congregation asked to transfer their membership here – a church within a greater Latino community and in which their own priest was also the Priest-in-Charge.

At this first service, there were 27 congregants present. The hope is for greater growth here on Timuquana, especially since the majority of the people served through our ministry partners are Latino. In the near future, we will have opportunities to interact at joint refreshment hours and maybe even a bilingual service or two. The hope is that we become one church in two languages.

# **Standing Watch-Prayer Vigil**

Only four days earlier, He had been heralded on His entrance into the Jerusalem. Everyone cheering and praising His name.

On that Thursday night, Jesus and His 12 disciples had supper together. They laughed, and talked, and ate. Jesus said that one of them would betray Him that night. As good friends do, they cried "Oh no, not one of us. We love you." They called Him "Master."

Jesus washed their feet to show them His love. He passed them bread and said, "Eat this in remembrance of Me." He gave them wine and said, "Drink this in covenant with Me."

The soldiers laid the cross on the ground at the top of a hill. They laid Jesus on the cross and nailed His body to it. They hoisted it up. Jesus hung there. No one gave Him water.

No one covered His naked body. Where were His friends, His disciples, to stand watch with Him?

After Jesus gasped His last breath—someone besides His friends, His disciples, His Last Supper buddies—took His body, bathed it, covered it, and placed it in the tomb.

Where were His friends, His disciples, to stand watch over Him? Three days later, at sunrise, the stone before the tomb rolled back and it was known that Jesus had risen from the grave. Where were His friends, His disciples, to stand watch for Him?


Well, we are here now at St. Peter's Church—His friends, His disciples—to stand watch with Him, over Him, and for Him.

# **Parishioner Spotlight**

A member of St. Peter's since the age of three, Leslie Oxford currently serves as Children's Ministry Director. She is also the founder and director of Rakad Dance Camp which is housed at St. Peter's.



Leslie was born in Bethesda, Maryland and was baptized at 11 days old because it was important to her parents to have her baptized in the church that they had been attending in Maryland. She and her family moved to Florida when Leslie was a month old.

She grew up in Orange Park and attended S. Bryan Jennings
Elementary, Orange Park Junior High School, and Orange Park High School. She earned her bachelor's degree in Religious Studies with a minor in criminology from Florida State University, and her master's degree in nonprofit management from University of Oregon.

Leslie grew up in a big blended family. Her parents got divorced when she was three years old, her sister Allison was six, and her brother Mitch was nine. Her mother, Virginia, married Walter Pillsbury when Leslie was six. With that marriage the family also grew with the addition of Walter's daughters Jennifer and Margie. In 2012 the family added 18-year-old Shane Cook to the family.

#### **Favorite Childhood Memory:**

Leslie has always had a vivid imagination and could play for hours with her doll house. She also loved playing outdoors with neighborhood friends. She started dance classes in the second grade and continued them through high school.
